Learning outcomes

By the end of the lesson, pupils will be able to: recall the 4 key rules relating to matches and lighters; detail what is required to make a 999 call; demonstrate the correct actions to take should their clothes catch fire

Parental engagement

Parents directed towards helping children to complete **Worksheet No. 9** know your address and **Worksheet No. 3** check your smoke alarms

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Face Changer Game (re-cap for Tools not Toys)

- Teacher to print the two sided face changer and build instructions
- Pupils to cut out and complete the dot-to-dot on the reverse of the face changer (colouring in is optional)
- Teacher demonstrates folds required with whole class or working in groups
- Split pupils to play face changer game in pairs



Step	Diagram	Explanation
1		Using your paper, cut out the pieces. Fold the paper in half to make the shape and glue the top flap to the bottom flap. Cut out the pieces and fold them in half.
2		Using your paper, cut out a square piece and fold the square piece from point A to D on their faces. Repeat points B, C, D and fold the paper. Repeat the process for the other 3 sides. Repeat until you have 4 sides. Open and to see all the faces you have made through the paper and glue.

4		Find the corner points A, B, C, D and glue them together. The paper will be folded in the next step. It is important to keep the corners on the top of the paper.
5		Glue all corners one folded in each other.
6		Find the corner points A, B, C, D and glue them together. This will result in a cube and a square.
7		With the cube (A) in place, fold the paper in half. Repeat points A to D and to C.

8		Push the two sides together and fold. Find the corner points A, B, C, D and glue them together. This will result in a cube and a square.
9		Repeat the process for the other 3 sides.

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How to make an emergency call using 999 or 112

The 999 emergency number can help save lives, but only if it is used properly. You should **never** use the number unless it is a real emergency. If you need the Police, Fire and Rescue Service, Ambulance, or Coastguard this is what you should do:

Play out 999 scenario using cut out laminate phones for caller and operator

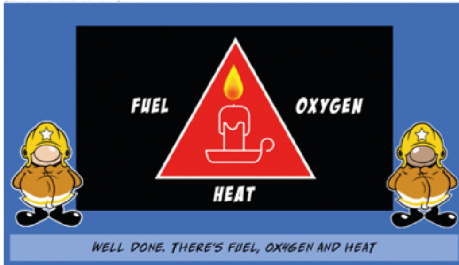


- **Make 999 call** - it's free from any phone
- **Tell the operator who you need to speak to** - they will ask you some questions about what has happened
- **Operator will ask you the address** - it's very important to know these things about where you live: *House number, Name of road* (they might ask you to spell it) *Town/City, Postcode*
- **Don't hang up until the operator tells you that you can.** Even though you might be scared it's important to remember that if you stay calm and answer all the questions someone will be on the way to help as quickly as possible

Don't forget, never make a 999 call unless it is a real emergency – someone who is in danger could be stopped from getting help if there is a hoax call

4 key messages about matches and lighters (recite to embed)



1. Are matches and lighters tools or toys? **[Tools]**
2. If you see matches and/or lighters lying around, who should you tell? **[A grown up]**
3. Why should you never play with matches & lighters? **[Because they are very dangerous, they burn and can cause a fire]**
4. If a friend or your brother/sister suggests playing with matches & lighters, what should you say? **[NO!]**

Fire Engine Jig-Saw
